


Wilmslow Road Cycleway

 5km route from Didsbury village to Whitworth Park

 20-minute cycle time*

 Route largely separated from other traffic by kerbs

A direct and continuous cycle route towards Manchester

Use of specific traffic signals just for cyclists – allowing you to set off ahead of other traffic

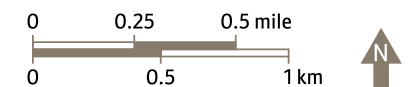
Connections to Fallowfield Loop

Bus stop bypasses along the route, minimising conflict between buses, traffic and cyclists



Cycle lanes separated from traffic

Wilmslow Road Cycleway

Wilmslow Road Cycleway links Didsbury, Withington, Fallowfield and Rusholme, and will also connect directly with Manchester city centre once further cycle lane improvements are completed on Oxford Road.

The route is mainly along the highway but special new kerbs have been built to give cyclists dedicated space away from other traffic for the majority of the cycleway. It also has new bus stop and car parking bypasses, allowing cyclists to enjoy their ride.
